

Overview: Teaching Enhancement Cycle

A teaching quality assurance project of the Learning Innovation Unit (LIU) piloted with the DCU Business School. The aim of the project is to create an online accessible, cyclical process whereby staff can gather feedback on their own teaching practice in order to self evaluate and move to positive, actionable change.

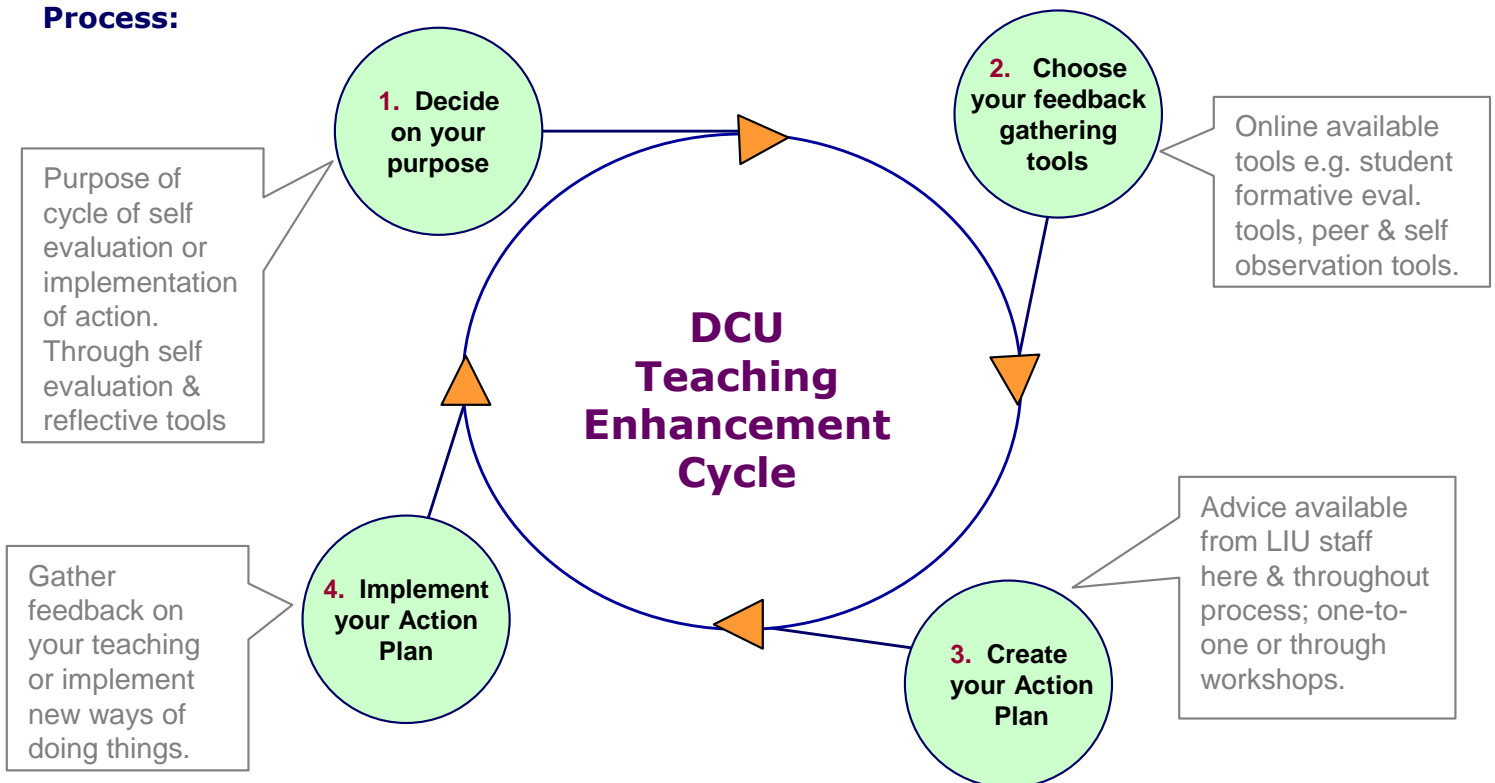
Objectives:

- Enhance the quality of teaching and student learning at DCU.
- Raise the profile of teaching activity.
- Inform requirements for staff development in teaching and learning.
- Provide evidence of the quality of teaching and of steps taken to improve the quality of teaching.

Methods and Action:

- Self evaluation approaches and resources researched.
- A suite of web-based and hard copy resources developed to enable staff to gather and analyse feedback on teaching quality and performance.
- Staff select relevant feedback mechanisms from a suite of self, peer and student evaluation tools and resources.
- Participants attend mid and end of semester workshops to focus on findings/outcomes, future actions and process.
- Process to be piloted with DCU Business School in academic year 2009/10.
- The process itself is evaluated by the LIU.
